

# ST NINIAN'S UNITING CHURCH MARCH 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2025

#### **BASED ON LUKE 13:1-9**



This week is about a fruit tree- in fact a fig tree. In the bible Jesus said he wants us to be like a fruit tree – not like the

one in the picture which has no fruit on it, a fruit tree that has lots of fruit. How do you think you could be like a fruit tree maybe an apple tree or an orange tree?

What Jesus meant was for a tree to make fruit it needs to planted in good sunshine and soil, watered, protected from bugs that might eat the leaves, and worms that might make their home in fruit. A good healthy tree also needs to cared for fertilised and pruned at the right time of the year. In other words, the tree can't be left and forgotten – uncared for. For a fruit tree to grow good fruit it needs to be cared for <u>all</u> the time not just sometimes. Without that kind of caring, and love, there will be no apples or oranges.

Unfortunately, the fig tree in the bible story that Luke wrote about didn't produce any fruit for three years and when the gardener found out he told the farmer to chop it down because it's taking up space on the farm that could be used for something else.


Naturally this upset the farmer, so the gardener gave the tree one more year to give fruit before it had to be cut down.


Just like that fruit tree, Jesus says he wants us to grow fruit. We aren't fruit trees, but we do have things like trust, faith and love, features or gifts and skills that show we really are followers of Jesus and try our best to do what Jesus wants us to do. But like a tree must actually be a fruit tree to bear fruit, we actually have to be Jesus' followers before we can bear fruit. Luke, one of the people who tells us stories about Jesus tells us to turn away from our wrong choices and believe in Jesus and what he can do for us or has already done for us. Then, like a tree that has the right water and sun to grow fruit, we too, can grow 'fruit'.


Dear Jesus, I know that sometimes I make wrong choices and I really want to follow you. help me to be better at doing what you want me to do.
