### **REFLECTION**

A short reflect for this week as we turn to a very familiar Christmas song commonly known as The Magnificat.

The Magnificat, beautifully expresses Mary's deep humility, joy and great faith in God. In today's reading Mary exclaims, "My soul glorifies the Lord," revealing her deep and very personal connection to God and her recognition of the greatness of God. The song is a powerful acknowledgment of God's faithfulness and mercy, not just in the life of Mary, but one that continues right through history.

The Magnificat is like a tapestry of many coloured threads each one giving a key aspect of God's character: God's concern for the humble, God's power to uplift those who live ordinary lives, and God's justice for those who are oppressed. Mary proclaims that God has "filled the hungry with good things" however, for those who are rich they leave empty, emphasising a divine reversal of what we consider to be normal social structures. In this, she reflects God's love and concern for the marginalised and reminds us of the importance of compassion, empathy and justice.

Mary's song is richly rooted in her lived experiences. As a young seemingly insignificant woman in a patriarchal society, her acceptance of God's call clearly shows us all just how deeply important her faith was to her. By proclaiming God's goodness and mercy, she becomes a voice for those who may feel voiceless and very small in today's levels of hierarchy, social media, and ideological discourse just to name a few. Mary encourages us all not to be afraid to put our trust in God's promises and to recognise God's activities in a damaged and violent world. When we look for and see the characteristics of God we can be encouraged to know that love, grace and peace still exist.

The Magnificat invites us to reflect on our own lives and how we respond to God's call. It calls us to adopt a posture of humility and gratitude, celebrating God's blessings while seeking to serve others. I read a post the other day which said, "If you can't serve, then you can't lead." Throughout Jesus' life, God's Son both served and lead people to a better and more just way of life and death. As his faithful followers in a world often focused on power, success, and material wealth, Mary's song offers a radical reminder of the values of the Kingdom of God – hope, love, mercy, and an upliftment of the humble, urging us to join in the song of praise and become instruments of God's hope and grace in a world in need.

# **INTERCESSORY PRAYER**

Lord of the heavens and the earth, I come to you today with a full of gratitude as I sit and ponder on Mary's beautiful song of praise. I thank you for her example of faith, humility, and once again, I surrender my life to you, to you to use as you will.

May your generous spirit inspire me to act with compassion and respond to the physical and spiritual needs of others. help me to be an instrument of mercy, sharing my blessings and advocating for social justice in a world that often overlooks the vulnerable.

Creator God, I pray for those who seek to glorify you in their lives, like Mary, and for those who are uncertain about their paths. Encourage them to trust in your plans, believing that with you nothing is impossible. Grant them confidence in your promises and a spirit of praise that overflows in their actions.

One more thing, Lord, I ask that you fill my heart with the joy and reverence that Mary speaks of in her song. May I echo her words in my lives, bringing glory to your name in all that I do. Help me to proclaim your greatness not only through my words but also through my actions, always acting as a reflection of your love in this very troubling world.
